PARK AND RECREATION -

Ray Smyth reported that the moisture content in the gymnasium floor was at an acceptable level to install the carpeting. It is hoped this will help with the acoustics in the room.

The Commission has suggested that a study for a bike path be considered connecting County Road #66 with the Community Center. It was felt, however, that road improvements and utility installations could disrupt the bike path. The City Engineer has suggested that the bike study be included with the road study which will also address sewer issues and safety issues.

The hiring of a warming house attendant will be reviewed by Ray Smyth as to whether the person is required to be an employee or can be a contract person.

UTILITIES -

The Commission recommended the purchase of laser optical equipment for the Cable Company at a cost exceeding \$25,000.00.

The search for a General Manager for the Utilities Company has been completed and a recommendation was made by the interview committee.

MOTION 12R-10-96 WAS MADE BY JACK WEBSTER AND SECONDED BY CHUCK MILLER TO HIRE KEVIN LARSON AS GENERAL MANAGER OF THE

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TELEPHONE COMPANY AT AN ANNUAL RATE OF \$60,000 PLUS BENEFITS.

RECYCLING - There was 7.57 tons of recyclables collected in November.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE - Nothing

OLD BUSINESS -

The City Attorney has prepared an Ordinance which would provide for recovery of costs incurred by the City for professional fees when developers request tax increment financing. The deposit to be paid by the developer will be \$4,500.00.

Jack Webster reported on the financial status of the new City Hall. Two buildings were sold for \$300,000. To date \$287,415.45 has been spent on the new building. A few small items remain to be done but the overall cost will come in under anticipated costs. Mayor Kolesar thanked Jack Webster and George Riches for keeping costs down.
